***Handy Tip:***

*Larger cable/cord organisers can be made by increasing the number of foundation chains and/or increasing the number of rows to length the cable/cord tidy*

# Crochet Cable/Cord Tidy Organiser

## Requirements:

I used 4 ply crochet cotton & a 3.50 (US:E) hook. You will also need sharp scissors, darning needle for sewing in ends, Button for closure

## Abbreviations:

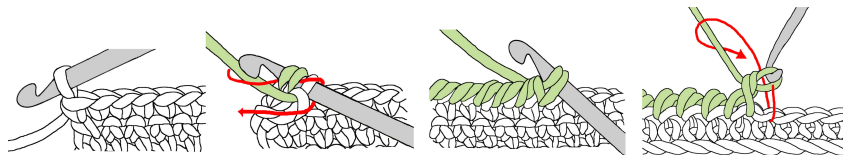
st/s = stitch/es	● = ss, slip st
▶ = finish off (FO)	○ = ch, chain
sp/s = space/s	⊕ = dc, double crochet
YO = yarn over	(US:sc, single crochet)
✕ = Dec, decrease	⊗ = Crab st

**Dec** = dc decrease

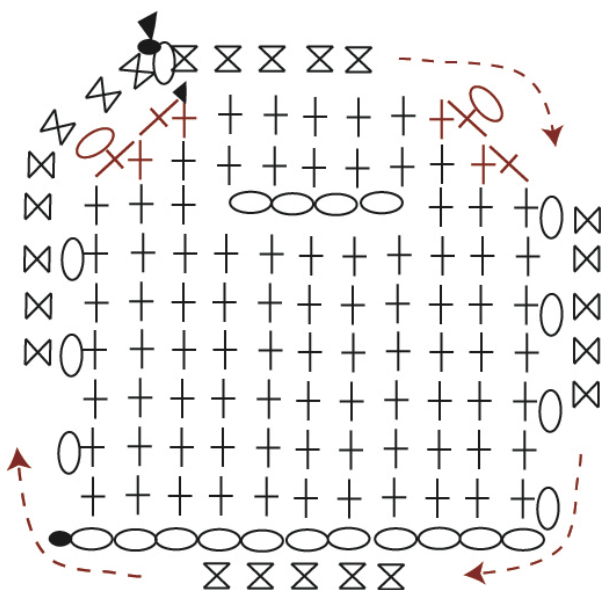
insert hook into st indicated & draw up a loop (2 loops on hook), insert hook into next st & draw up a loop (3 loops on hook, YO & draw through 3 loops).

**Crab st:** (reverse dc) *always worked on right side & in the opposite direction as usual*

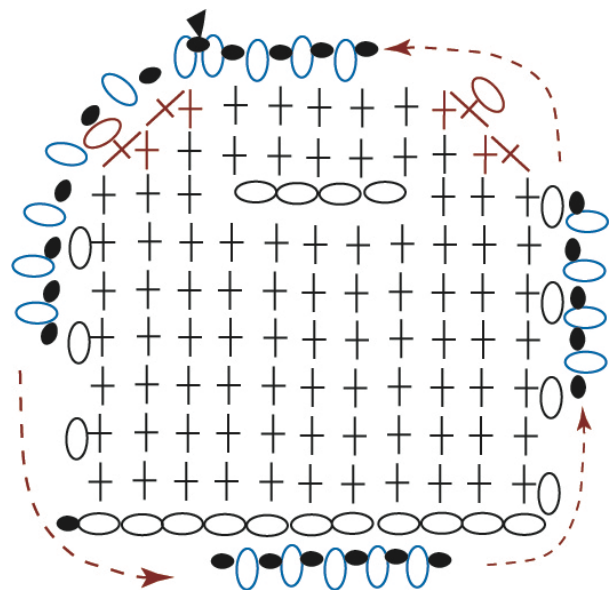
join where needed, 1 ch, \* insert hook into the next st on **right**, YO & draw up a loop, YO & draw through both loops on hook, repeat from \* around, join with ss to first st, FO.



Crab st edging



ss/ch edging



Start with 12 chains

**Row 1:**

dc (US: sc) in 2nd ch from hook & in each ch across = 11 sts

**Rows 2 - 19** (*or until work measures approx 9 cm (3 1/2")*):

1 ch, turn, dc (US: sc) in each st across = 11 sts

**Row 20:**

1 ch, turn dc (US: sc) in first 3 sts, 4 ch, skip 5 sts, dc (US: sc) in last 3 sts = 6 x dc (US: sc), 1 x 4-ch loop

**Row 21:**

1 ch, turn, Dec (*over first 2 sts*), dc (US: sc) in next st, 5 dc (US: sc) into 4-ch loop, dc in next st, Dec (*over last 2 sts*) = 9 x sts

**Row 22:**

1ch, turn, Dec (*over first 2 sts*), dc (US: sc) in next 5 sts, Dec (*over last 2 sts*) = 7 x sts

*Do not finish off, do not turn,*

**Edging No 1: Crab St**

1 ch, work Crab st evenly around, FO.

**Edging No 2:** *for those who struggle with Crab st*

1 ch, then work \*ss in next st, 1 ch, repeat from \* around all sides, join with ss to first st.

Sew on a button, sew in all tail ends & you're done.
